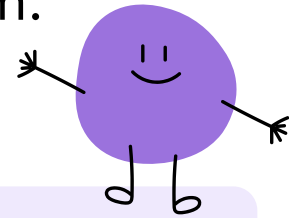
Noah's Sporty Month
